

QUESTIONS AND RESPONSES

On December 4, 2012, we received the following comment:

“I find it troubling that your identity is obscure. I am not anointed and don't currently attend meetings. But I'm not afraid of people knowing who I am. I suspect we are still in the age of darkness. "True love throws fear outside."”

To the author, thank you for your email. Though you did not ask us a question, we feel it would be helpful to those who visit our site for us to respond to your comment both privately and publicly.

You mention that you are troubled that our ‘identity is obscure.’ We wonder what it is you want to know about us. If we published our names, our race, our gender, our national affiliation, even our home address, would that change the content of the articles on our site? Would that change the content of our message? No. The only purpose it would serve is to placate those who are looking to examine the messengers rather than the message. We want to avoid that folly and so we omit our personal identification from the site, though our local elders, circuit servant, and many of our friends know who we are.

Our site is not intended to be a social gathering place where we exchange personal information. It is designed as an source of uplifting spiritual information where we share ideas.

For example, you identify yourself by name. Yet, that tells us nothing. What says the most about you is your message – that you are not anointed and do not attend meetings. To Jehovah’s Witnesses, and ex-Witnesses, that means you do not believe you are a son of God. Our site was established to help all people recognize their true relationship to the Father, namely as sons and daughters with the heavenly hope. (*Galatians 3:26; Romans 8:16-17; Philippians 3:14-15*)

If you have not understood our message, or have trouble believing that you are indeed ‘anointed’ (though you have not realized or accepted it yet), please write us again and we will be happy to respond.
